



What can History Day students get out of the Archives Crawl?



You may be able to find a research topic that relates to this year's theme: **Triumph & Tragedy In History**. Many of the archives and libraries at the event have historical material that would make for appropriate and distinctive history day projects. Be sure to ask the archivists about the primary sources found at their institution. Archives are a great place to find **primary sources** – from photographs to letters to diaries and much, much more.

What local history topics are relevant to this year's History Day theme?

Be sure to ask the archivists for their ideas about the History Day theme and how historical material in their archive could be developed into a project. Below are some examples to help you get your brainstorming started:

- The Tragedy of the Sacramento Squatter's Riot of 1850
- California's State Capitol: How Sacramento Triumphed
- The Triumph of Reform: The 1921 Sacramento City Charter
- Economic Tragedy: Hoovervilles and Hobo Jungles along the American River
- The West End & Capitol Mall Projects: The Tragedy of Sacramento's Redevelopment
- · Sacramento Attorney Nathaniel Colley and the Triumph of Civil Rights
- Triumph or Tragedy?: the 1964 Annexation of North Sacramento

The odds of winning are based on the number of eligible entries received. Family members of Sacramento Archives Crawl staff and volunteers are not eligible to win.
